## 2006 CROP WALK RESULTS ARE IN

The results of the 2006 Auburn CROP Walk were announced at a steering committee meeting last month. Overall, the walk brought in \$7,550.00, almost 22% less than what was collected in 2005. Last fall there were 131 walkers from 11 local churches and organizations. Twenty-five percent of the proceeds were divided equally between the Auburn Interfaith Food Closet and the Salvation Army in Auburn. Each group received \$934.00. Auburn Presbyterian Church was number one among all participating organizations in 2006 with \$1,628.00 collected by 24 APC walkers.

The 2007 CROP Walk will be held on Sunday, October 14 in downtown Auburn. The three-mile walk begins and ends at St. Luke's Episcopal Church. The walk is sponsored by Church World Service, which uses 75% of the funds collected for disaster relief, refugee assistance, and the eradication of hunger and poverty. More information and pledge forms will be available in early September.

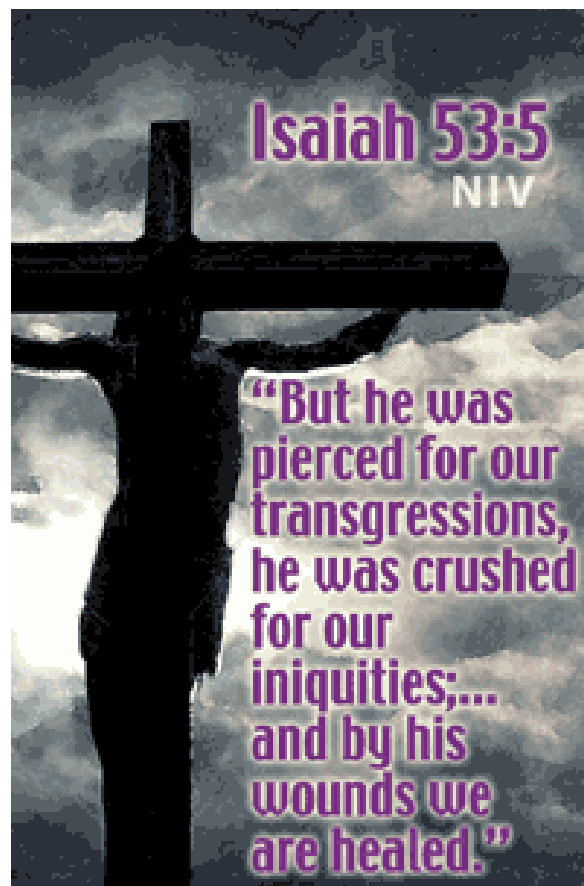
### ***BIG THANK YOU FROM AUBURN INTERFAITH FOOD CLOSET***

The year 2006 was another highly successful and very busy one for the Auburn Interfaith Food Closet. Volunteers, including many from APC, worked 6,287 hours to provide food items for 147,501 emergency meals. The Food Closet serves an average of 1,366 individuals each month—40% of whom are children. During the past year \$68,535.00 was used to purchase food items beyond those donated. The Sponsor-A-Family program resulted in \$51,423.00. Other proceeds came from donations by the 18 supporting local churches, non-profit organizations, corporations, individuals, and grants. Donated food items came from hundreds of individual church attendees and from special events, such as Stuff-A-Bus Days, the Letter Carriers Food Drive, "Kids Can" school food drive, the Boy Scouts "Scouting for Food" program, Placer High School's "Placer Palooza", and others.

So, a BIG "Thank you" to all who volunteered, contributed, supported or helped in any way to share the blessings with those in need in the Auburn and Meadow Vista area.

The need to supply emergency food continues to increase, unfortunately, as more and more people struggle to deal with the high cost of housing, health care, fuel, utilities, insurance, etc. In 2007 the Food Closet is expanding its service area to include Newcastle and Ophir. To meet the need this year's budget calls for spending \$85,000.00 on food item purchases. Your continued support is always appreciated.

## EASTER WEEK EVENT DETAILS

### Sunday, April 1, Palm Sunday

Easter week is a busy one. Palm Sunday, on April 1, starts as the joyous entry of Jesus into Jerusalem, the people waving palms to celebrate their deliverance from the cruel Roman occupation. We celebrate that same joyous arrival, waving our palms and singing songs of joyous welcome.

### Maundy Thursday, April 5, Seder

Maundy Thursday, April 5, we share the same Passover Meal Jesus shared with his disciples. This is the ancient meal, commanded by God to be observed forever. We are directed to remember that God delivered the Israelites from tyranny and slavery. For 3500 years, this meal has been observed. This year we also observe this meal with our second Seder celebration. At 6 PM, we will gather together,

fresh. The time for delivery is 10 AM - 12:00 noon. If you miss this time, leave your flowers in a container with water in it, and they will be retrieved Sunday morning.

### Easter Sunday, April 8

The morning begins with the 6:30 AM Sunrise Service. Bring your own chair and maybe an extra for a guest. We will have a fire pit, and toss a brand in the fire to praise God, or confess our sins, or express our gratitude for God's blessings. Hymns and a message complete this early service. We remember the discovery by the three Marys that Jesus was not in the tomb. **He is Risen!**

### Breakfast - 7:30 AM

Norm Clow and his crew are promising a delicious breakfast. This is a powerful incentive to get up for the Sunrise Service when a hearty breakfast is in the offing.

### Worship - 10 AM

In addition to the promise of the beautiful floral cross another surprise will be unveiled for you. What a great day this will be. Come and worship, worship Christ, God's own Son.

The congregation and corporation of Auburn Presbyterian Church is called to meet on Sunday, April 15 after worship, to consider a change to the Bylaws.

*Should section 7.4 of the Bylaws be amended to read:*

*"One-third of the Elders and Deacons shall be elected each year. To insure proper rotation of officers, Elders shall be divided into three (3) classes of ~~(3)~~ (2) each; and the Deacons shall be divided into three (3) classes of three (3) each. (Passed by Session 4-0.)*

### EMERGENCY?

Put ICE in your cell phone. A recent article from the Toronto Star, "The ICE Idea", is catching on, and it is a very simple, yet important method of contact for you or a loved one in case of an emergency. As cell phones are carried by the majority of the population, all you need to do is program the number of a contact person or persons and store the name as "ICE". The idea was thought up by a paramedic who found that when they went to the scenes of accidents, there were always mobile phones with patients, but they didn't know which numbers to call. He therefore thought that it would be a good idea if there was a nationally recognized name to file



"next of kin" under. Following a disaster in London, The East Anglian Ambulance Service has launched a national "In Case of Emergency (ICE)" campaign. The idea is that you store the word "ICE" in your mobile phone address book and with it enter the number of the person you would want to be contacted "In Case of Emergency," In an emergency situation, 'Emergency Services' personnel and hospital staff would then be able to quickly contact your next of kin, by simply dialing the number programmed under "ICE".

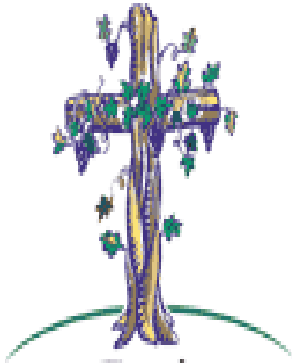

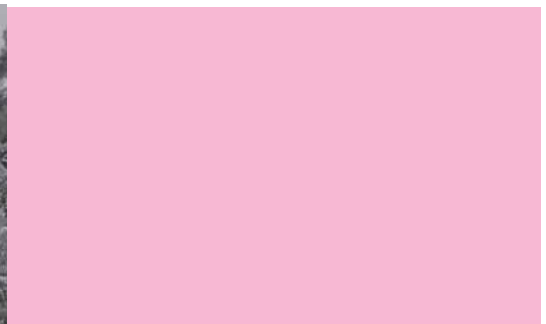
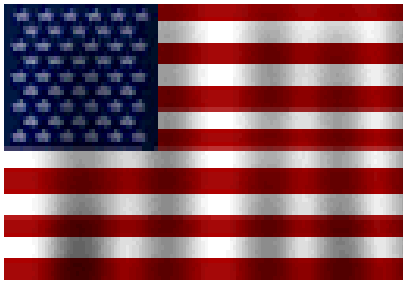
