A PASSION FOR GOD

"disciples of Jesus", too.

But Jesus did not intend that this would be the only prayer his disciples prayed. He, himself, spent hours with God in prayer. (e.g., Luke 6:12) He developed (my opinion here) a capacity to connect with God in each moment. Remember when the woman caught in adultery was brought to him (John 8:3-



11)? John records Jesus stooped down; the conversation/confrontation stopped for a moment. John says Jesus "wrote on the ground" (NIV), and many have speculated Jesus wrote the sins of the people around him, or some such. But I think he was just doodling while he was asking God for guidance. Then Jesus stood up and gave this incredibly creative reply to the challenge of the moment. It was clearly "a God thing", as we say. Jesus knew where to go to get those great/God things that would make God's heart glad.

Later, Jesus said, "I tell you the truth, anyone who has faith in me will do what I have been doing. He will do even greater things than these, because I am going to the Father." (John 14:12) Anyone who has faith in him— isn't that you? But not many of us are doing what—and more than—Jesus did. Hmm. Is there a problem here? You bet! We've fallen for "Christen-dumb" (the Christendom paradigm that delegates to the hired holy (men and women) "real ministry", while the rest of us just show up and give money, and learn what to believe. Dumb. One of the Enemy's best ideas.



Are you still with me?

What if . . . What if we believed Jesus, and took this to be his expectation of us? How in the world would we do "greater things than these"? Wouldn't we have to have the same living connection with God (his/our Father) that Jesus had? How could we develop that? If we set aside such time as Jesus did, what would we do with it? How would we pray?

This is exactly what you can learn and practice if you sign up for the "Prayer in the Making" Seminar we are hosting at APC August 20-21 (Friday evening, most of Saturday). Rev. Dan Prout, a Presbyterian pastor known to some of you and Director of Sierra Ministries International, will be teaching us how to develop that dynamic, living relationship with God that is prayer.

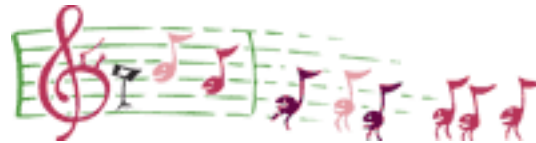

Please place any of the follow in the hamper: empty egg cartons (AIFC buys eggs in bulk and packages them for distribution in contributed egg cartons.), large, brown, handled bags (AIFC packs food to give to individuals and families in these bags.), canned or packaged, non perishable food, and unopened small lotion, soap, and shampoo bottles stocked in hotels and motels that you don't use. (When traveling, have a small plastic bag in your suitcase to store these.)

Each week, one of APC's volunteers at AIFC collects the items in the hamper and takes them to the Food Closet. They are delighted to find an ample supply in the hamper.

HAVE YOU BEEN BAPTIZED?

PRAYER AND HEALING SERVICE DETAILS

You may wonder why and how we started the Prayer and Healing Service we currently have on the 3rd Friday night of each month. Pastor Ken had been wanting such a service for several years but waited for the Lord's timing. Jerry and Silva Stearn moved to Cool from Sunnyvale where Silva had been actively involved in First Presbyterian Church of Sunnyvale's prayer and healing ministry. Their teams now pray for people following the Sunday morning service. She mentioned it to Pastor Ken when she and Jerry joined APC.

People known to be interested in prayer were invited to meet together to talk about the possibilities for such a service. Some had had some experience in praying for people others had never even witnessed it. Silva and Bev went to the training conference held by people active in the ministry of The Healing Rooms of Nevada County. They brought the information and printed material back and taught the others what they had learned. A number of meetings were held for practice where each person in the group received prayer and participated in praying for others. Specific plans were made.

When the group thought they were ready, they announced the first service. This has continued with the exception of one month when nearly everyone was to be gone. Before each service, several come to set up the stations and arrange other physical aspects of the service. Just before 6 p.m., the other members of the team arrive to pray for the service. At 6:40 p.m. anything remaining to be done is assigned. One or two are designated as greeters. After the service, everything is rearranged and the team assembles for debriefing and prayer.

On the fourth Monday afternoon, the team meets to plan the service for the next month to be sure someone is assigned to take care of each detail. On odd numbered months, this is followed by what is called the Formation Meeting. It is further training but also a time when new people come to learn more about it to see if they want to be part of the team. Currently, the training

videos from The Healing Rooms of Santa Maria are being viewed and discussed. The ministry at APC is somewhat different from the way it is done in the Healing Rooms ministries. They have a team in each of several rooms. Those prayed for are interviewed in some depth prior to receiving prayer. It is not preceded by a service as is done at APC. Ours is basically following the First Presbyterian Church of Sunnyvale model with additions from the Healing Room experience.

If you are interested in participating in this ministry, talk to Pastor Ken or Silva Stearn. Everyone is encouraged to come at 7 p.m. on the 3rd Friday night of each month.



PRAYER IN THE MAKING SEMINAR

Now is the time to buy your ticket for the Prayer in the Making Seminar, August 24-25, 7-9:30 p.m. on Friday evening and 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Saturday. The cost is \$40 for adults, \$20 for youth 12-24. This is a landmark opportunity for the members of our church to learn more about prayer and be led closer to the Lord. It is a great way to start our new church year.

Auburn Presbyterian Church is sponsoring this seminar for our area. People from other churches are invited and urged to buy tickets and come. Encourage your friends to attend with you. Anyone within driving distance should be invited.

Dan Prout, popular speaker at conferences, now President of Sierra Ministries International, a transdenominational group incorporated in 1985 which focuses on prayer, worship, and unity in the Body of Christ is the instructor.

Let's do this as a church. A majority of our Session elders plan to attend so they are more fully prepared to be spiritual leaders of our congregation. Let's join with them. Prayer is vital as we seek to "Passionately love the Lord Jesus Christ and radiate that love to every individual."

The Christian Ed. team is praying that God is calling some of you to help with the children once a month. We are looking for assistants, baby cuddlers/nurturers and teachers. Many of those who have been called to help have been joyfully, faithfully doing so for most of their years at APC. PLEASE REMEMBER TO PRAY FOR BURMA

In June and July, the Sunday School children have been studying about what it means to be a missionary and what missionaries do. They have collected a variety of items to send to Thailand for The Good Life Club that helps refugees from Burma. They will go into what we are calling "Burma Bags" as they request these items be packed in gallon sized zip lock freezer bags. The Good Life Club comes from John 10:10 where Jesus promises abundant life. Those helping the children on the run, hiding with their families in the jungles of Burma, are trusting for a better life for all of them.

These are the items being collected: Pediatric vitamins (Gerber Vitamin Drops, for example), caps, hand mitts, shirts, small teethingers, small fingernail clippers, small combs and mirrors, boxes of chewable vitamins, child size toothbrushes, adult size fingernail clippers and very small toys.

Pray for:

- For God's light of truth and love to penetrate every part of Burma.
- For freedom and lasting peace for the whole of Burma.
- For justice and the desire within all those in leadership to work for the good of everyone they represent.
- For relief teams of all ethnic-groups to be trained and sent to give help, hope, and love to the oppressed.
- For friends around the world to stand up for the people of Burma.
- For the restoration of democracy, ethnic rights and freedom for all political prisoners.

Please remember that in 2006 alone, The Burma Army displaced over 25,000 villagers in Northern Karen State (a section of Burma) seeking to exterminate this people group, most likely because they are chiefly Christian. Of the 50 million people who call Burma home, a million of these are refugees in neighboring countries.

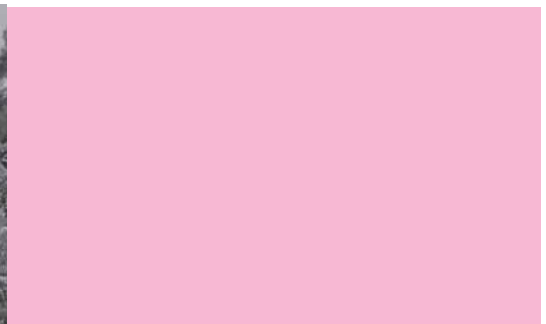
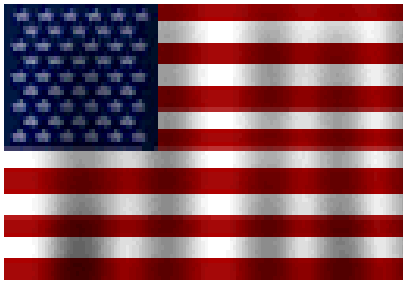
