## 2007 CROP HUNGER WALK SUNDAY, OCTOBER 14

The 2007 Auburn CROP Hunger Walk will be held Sunday, October 14. Please note that the word "Hunger" has been added to the name this year in an effort to better identify the vital purpose of the event. Teams of Crop Walkers will meet at St. Luke's Episcopal Church at 1:00 p.m. The Walk itself begins at 1:30 p.m. The three-mile course is an easy jaunt through downtown Auburn. As in the past, walkers are needed to solicit pledges in order to raise funds to benefit the Auburn Interfaith Food Closet, the Auburn Salvation Army and Church World Service—three organizations devoted to the alleviation of hunger, locally and worldwide. Those who choose not to walk or who are unable to walk can participate in the CROP Hunger Walk by pledging donations to those who do walk. More information and pledge forms will be available in mid-September.

APC has a history of being one of the top teams in terms of number of walkers and funds pledged to the annual CROP Hunger Walk. Help to continue that commitment to this worthy cause. Plan now to participate for 2007.

## APC LEADERSHIP RETREAT 2007

“A great church is one in which it’s members become ministers themselves, people that minister to the needs of others and that is cool!”

When we speak of Directing the development of congregations, we usually speak of church leadership, and we usually mean the work that the pastors do in giving direction, equipping, and motivating members of a congregation to participate in the congregation’s vision mission statements in the church and in local Auburn community and beyond. By this definition, almost everything that a pastor does, whether preaching a sermon, teaching, or engaging in what some call “vision casting,” contributes to his or her approach of leadership. But some tasks are ones in which pastors more directly exercise leadership—for example, administering the congregation’s affairs, including attending congregational meetings. In addition, is equipping members for their ministries.



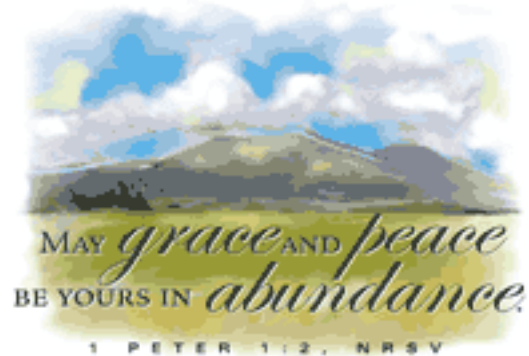
As shown in the my last report to the church, the national survey of clergy, 15 percent of the average pastor’s week is

spent in administering the congregation’s affairs and attending congregational meetings. Another 13 percent is spent in training or equipping people for ministry. If we are to become a transformed ministry, we, I and yes you need to become ministers as well. Many of our church folks have already joined the cause with our pastor in ministering to the needs of others. What could you do this year...?

**TO THOSE ATTENDING THE RETREAT: (Staff, Elders, Deacons and Ministry Leaders)** Pastor, many others, and I are spending hours in preparing for what is to be our first annual leadership retreat in October. This without a doubt is the most important time we will spend

this year. This retreat will engage us all in discerning in what are the more specific activities we will engage in, in order to accomplish the four Mission Statements we have identified as part of our Act Two Vision and Values. Pastor Ken says: “I believe this is the most important meeting in our church’s history, and I want you there.”

Early Friday morning, everyone boarded the Amtrak train for Richmond, switched to BART and then walked to the church that is located next to Dreyer's world corporation headquarters. Alas, the ice cream parlor was closed the Friday and Saturday that the Extreme Team was there!

Not all was work. The Extreme Team played Sardines in the church which has many places for the person hiding to disappear. When the searchers found that person, they stayed with them, hidden until the last person found the whole group.

It was so successful a trip that the team wants to return and stay longer. Come join the Extreme Team for other adventures such as ice skating, snow trips, service projects, and weekly application of Jesus' lessons as well as fellowship, games and snacks.

## WE USE EQUAL EXCHANGE COFFEE

Our church uses fairly traded coffee. Equal Exchange was founded in 1986 to create a new approach to trade, one that includes informed consumers, honest and fair trade relationships, and cooperative principles. They have accomplished this by offering consumers fairly traded gourmet coffee, tea, and cocoa direct from small-scale farmer co-ops in Latin America, Africa, and Asia.

Instead of large corporation pressure to accept a lower return and growing poorer, farmers sell through Equal Exchange, their co-op partner that markets their products to consumers around the world at a fair trade rate. Congregations, churches, community groups, individuals and faith based organizations such as The Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), Lutheran World Relief, American Friends Service Committee, Catholic Relief Services, Brethren Witness, Mennonite Central Committee, U.S., the Church of Christ, the United Methodist Committee on Relief, and the Unitarian-Universalist Committee partner with Equal Exchange.

Auburn Presbyterian Church uses this coffee in its fellowship activities at the church. Opportunity is sometimes given for individuals to purchase the coffee, especially when we have a Christmas Fair.

The coffee is shade grown. "Shade grown" is partly about birds, their preservation, and the protection of their natural habitats in coffee growing regions. Much of the world's coffee is grown by small-scale farmers. Due to the low prices paid by the conventional coffee market, many of these farmers are forced to clear cut their land in hopes of growing more coffee and increasing overall production. This increase comes at a cost to their communities, their land, and wildlife.

Because Equal Exchange buys direct, provides advance credit, and always guarantees a minimum floor price, farmers have the opportunity to break the cycle of poverty, and can make the economic choice to farm their land

sustainably. By doing so they are able to grow alternative cash and food crops in addition to coffee, protect themselves and their families from harmful chemical inputs, preserve the land and the soil for future generations, and protect local and migratory birds.

Benefits of Fair Trade these evidences of a living wage are seen in these communities – first public bus line, secondary school construction, health clinic construction, educational scholarships for children, women's economic development programs, rain forest preservation projects.

The Heifer Project International received \$551 from the 2006 Christmas Giving Tree. This is providing impoverished families with the livestock and training that they desperately need to break the cycle of poverty and hunger and build sustainable futures.

The good news is that the Worldwide Mission Team (WWMT) is electing to support the Good Life Club's collection of basic necessities for the Karen in Burma a priority for APC's Christmas project and will not be asking for contributions to Operation Christmas Child (the shoe box toy drive) that we have done in the past.

In John 10:10, Jesus promises abundant life. This promise is especially applicable to the Karen and other Burmese hill tribe children who are on the run, hiding with their families in the jungles of Burma from Burmese soldiers who are killing them and burning their homes. Many of the Karen people are Christians.

Christians Concerned for Burma started The Good Life Club located in Chiangmai, Thailand. They will disperse the items to the people who need them. They are very specific about what they need. Everything must fit in a Ziploc plastic bag that can be easily carried by the children and or their mothers wherever they may be.

You can participate by putting items together as follows in one gallon plastic Ziploc bags or by supplying any of the following items. Bring them to the church and place them in the box provided in the narthex. The Summer Sunday School children collected items while they were studying what mission means. We have a good start!

For the mothers and children:

- Multivitamins (for mom)
- Pediatric vitamins (Gerber Vitamin Drops, for example) for children
- Small cap, hand mitts and a shirt (not a one-piece) (It gets very cold in the mountains of Burma!) A tether/pacifier;
- small fingernail clippers

For the children:

- Small comb and mirror
- One box of children's chewable vitamins
- Child size toothbrushes
- Fingernail clippers

A small toy (must fit in plastic bags).

WWMT members are also asking for donations of cash to help defray the cost of the shipping which is very expensive. We need these items no later than November 11, 2007. Make checks out to APC but designate the funds for the Christmas Mission project.

Include a picture/drawing of yourself or your family and a postcard showing Auburn, CA so that the mothers and children can get an idea of the people who are praying for and helping them. We will also include the church address so that you can receive correspondence if you wish.

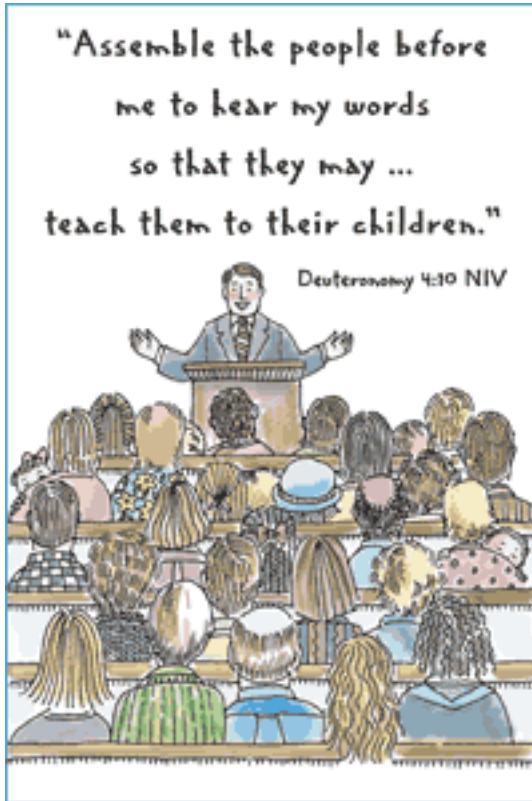

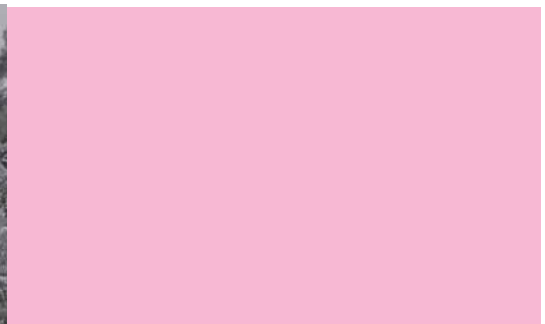
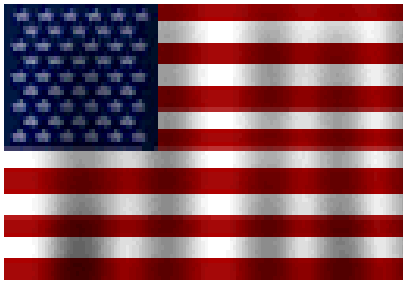
