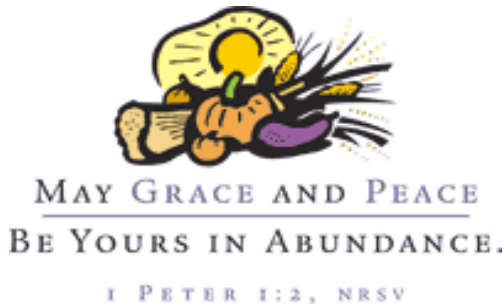

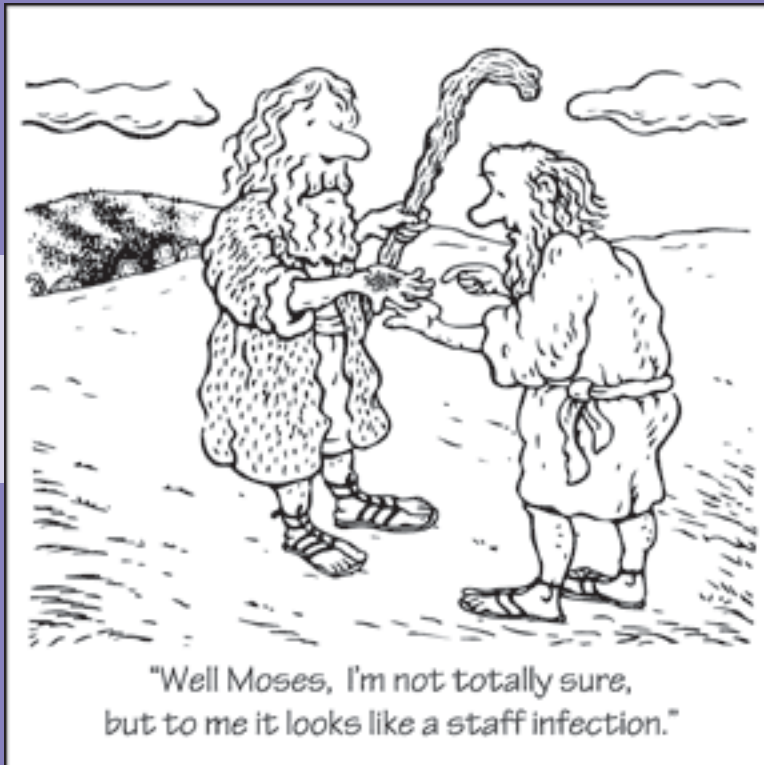
the growing season. Many thanks also to all who participated in the Fall Church-wide clean up, getting us ready for the coming winter

# WOMAN TO WOMAN

**MILK...IT DOES THE BODY GOOD...** Do you remember this slogan that must have sold thousands...if not millions...of people on the value of having milk in their diet? Famous celebrities and sports notables were seen in magazine ads, television commercials and on billboards all across the country proclaiming the benefits of milk while proudly sporting creamy white moustaches.

...**did you know** that Paul, in 1<sup>st</sup> Peter (2:2) was one of the first to encourage us all desire the pure milk of God's word that we might mature and taste the goodness of God? And, as we mature, he tells us later, in Hebrews, (5:11-14) we should expect to dine on more solid food.

**Where are you?**....Are you still thumbing through the Bible on occasion hoping to find something to guide you, encourage you, grow you....or maybe just confirm something you've already decided? Or perhaps your Bible mostly rests in a privileged place because it is, after all, a sacred writing....even though you find it too difficult to understand....and really don't have the time, anyway. Then again, maybe you've spent years with your Bible...your old friend...a worn and dog eared but still alive and speaking to you every day. Well, whoever or wherever you are in your relationship with God and His Word ...I have a **word to the WISE for you....**

....**READ ON...**After five years with Bible Study Fellowship, a year in the Bethel Series, and 30 years of numerous other studies which I attended, led, even designed.....plus women's

retreats, conferences, seminars, and various other programs....after seeking and writing and journaling on my own through Scripture....I wasn't sure I really 'needed' another Bible Study. Besides, I was retired. Wasn't there something 'more fun' I could do?

I visited an APC women's study which met monthly for about a year. It was a wonderful opportunity to meet some beautiful and faithful women and be welcomed into this, my new church home. Every year they studied something new, met in each other's houses and enjoyed fellowshiping together. Their arms were always open, but, eventually, my life here became more active and I took a break.

Yet a few years ago, when WISE came to APC I realized I still needed to be around other women where I have always found encouragement, support, loving fellowship....not to mention food and laughter! What could be more fun and invigorating than that? I began attending W.I.S.E. (Women in Search of Excellence) held right here at APC on **Thursday mornings at 9:30** (The same class is also available **Wednesday evenings at 7:00**) The speaker

taught from her heart. Every woman identified with her struggles. We laughed and cried with her, and after the sharing of our lesson within a small group format and receiving affirmation and words of encouragement within that setting, I don't think any woman left feeling as if her time there has been wasted. I know I didn't.



The study this fall focuses on ***The Seven Last Words of Christ***. Although it began the middle of September there is still a place for you, because each lesson stands alone. Are you looking for some good healthy nourishment? Try

WISE (or any other study offered for women here at APC) ....It really does a **body good!**

## FOCUS ON BURMA

On Sunday, September 9, Bill Michel shared exciting news. At the time of the church service, a friend of Gracie's who was going to Thailand had with her a suitcase holding all the items Sunday School children and others collected this summer. She was going to Chaing Mai where she would deliver it to The Good Life Club headquartered here. Then, it would be given to a team of Free Burma Rangers to deliver to people in Burma hiding in the jungles fleeing for their lives from the government troops.

There is evidence that notice is starting to be taken of this long standing civil war. Jim Carey has video and other information on You Tube. If you bring up You Tube and then do a Search for Jim Carrey, you get his Cal to Action on Burma and Aung San Suu Kyi which says Jim Carely calls for people to support the world's only imprisoned Nobel Peace Prize recipient Aung San Suu Kyi. He also decries Burma's military regime for recruiting more child soldiers than any other country in the world, destroying 3,000 villages in eastern Burma, and forcing 1.5 million refugees to flee. He appeals to viewers to join two organizations: [www.uscampaignforburma.org](http://www.uscampaignforburma.org), [www.humanrightsactioncenter.org](http://www.humanrightsactioncenter.org). We understand that Larry King will have Jim Carrey on his program soon to talk about this critical problem. Keep praying that God will intervene in some way and stop this violence.

On October 7, World Communion Sunday and Peacemaking Sunday, Dean Ecke and Bill Michel made a presentation giving background on the problem and updating what is happening today in Burma. Information will continue to come as we continue to focus on Burma.

Here are the items we ask people to bring to put in the treasure chest on the Information Table. Let's see how many times we can fill that box by Christmas.

Multivitamins (for mom)

Pediatric vitamins (Gerber Vitamin Drops, for example) for young children

Small cap, hand mitts and a shirt (not a one-piece) (It gets very cold in the mountains of Burma.) A tether/pacifier, small fingernail clippers.

For the children: Small comb and mirror, boxes of children's chewable vitamins. Child size toothbrushes., fingernail clippers.

## THE PRESBYTERIAN PEACEMAKING OFFERING

In our boxes of offering envelopes, there are some that are different. There is a "Deacons Offering" envelope for each month, and there are six other unusual envelopes. One gives us an opportunity to give to the cost of the envelopes themselves, and there's one in there for the "per capita" expense of running our church structures. The other four are provided for the four special national church offerings each year.

We took the One Great Hour of Sharing offering last spring, the Pentecost Offering in early summer, and on World Communion Sunday, which falls on October 7<sup>th</sup> this year, we take up the Peacemaking Offering. The Peacemaking Offering supports Peacemaking Coordinators in many of our presbyteries across the country, and provides grants to local projects that serve as models to others. In addition, this offering is unusual in that a percentage is retained for a church to give to its own local peacemaking effort. Most years, we have made our grant to Peace for Families/Placer Women's Center, to help in their work of restoring peace to families in conflict. Please give generously to our Presbyterian Peacemaking Offering.

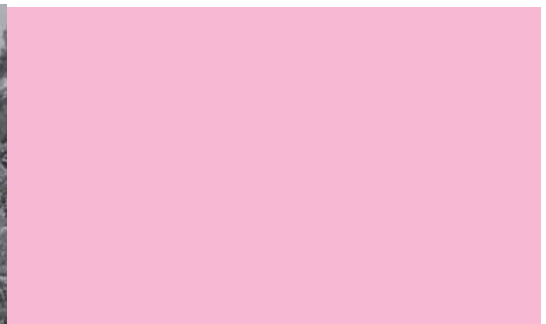
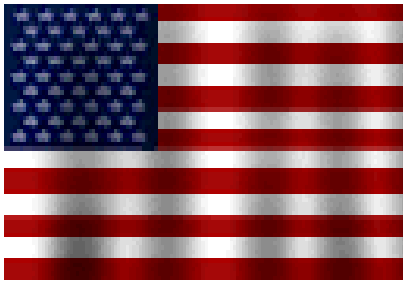
